Last year the case of the Railroad Puppies made news around the country. Some may not be aware that the same person who was convicted of abusing the railroad puppies was arrested just weeks later for abusing the parents of those puppies. The parents, along with two other abused dogs, would become known as the U-haul Dogs. A detective on the case tells their story . . .

"I am a detective for an Albany County police department. It was January 26th, 2013, one of the coldest days of the year. Our dispatchers received a call for dogs locked in the back of a U-haul truck. The caller said they had been there for days. When the units arrived, they approached a male in the area of the U-haul and asked him to open it; he begrudgingly did. Inside were found four pit bulls — three pit bulls in a cage fit for one, and a pregnant female searching for food in the compartment (there was none). All of the dogs were freezing and starving.

"Adam was in the worst condition of all. We initially thought he was a puppy! He weighed only 27 pounds and was skin and bones — probably just hours away from freezing or starving to death.

"The dogs were seized and brought to the veterinary emergency clinic, where the staff worked to warm the dogs' internal body temperature. All of the dogs were transferred to Mohawk Hudson Humane Society, where the vets and staff worked around the clock to get them healthy. I fell in love with my





Adam immediately and knew when the court case was over I would be adopting him.

"After several months of TLC, Adam now weighs a robust 70 pounds. His before picture is unrecognizable, except for his beautiful eyes. Adam has a warm home he shares with my four other rescues and his own pool to cool down in the summer.

He is the most gentle and loving dog. I am so grateful for the rock-solid case put forth by my department and the tireless effort of the veterinarians, staff and volunteers who worked so hard to save him."

The owner was arrested, pled guilty, and was sentenced to time served and probation. The other dogs rescued from the truck were all nursed back to health. The pregnant female gave birth to three pups within days of warming up, and all of the dogs and pups were adopted into good homes.

From the Director

Too often we hear stories in the news about animals that are suffering and abused, with little legal recourse toward those causing the suffering. Even when offenders are caught, their sentences are often too short. Jail time is a rarity in animal cruelty cases. I share the frustration many feel when our felony-level cruelty laws are so rarely used and the maximum sentence is one of the lowest of any felony in New York State.

Whenever there is an animal cruelty case in the news, there is an outpouring of support for the victims and widespread demands for harsh penalties against the offenders. When we see stories about puppy mills and other unscrupulous breeders, people are outraged. So why aren't the offenders punished appropriately for their bad deeds?

There is overwhelming support for animals but few laws to protect them. The laws that are on the books are often poorly written, filled with loopholes and carry minimal penalties. In addition, we also have what I call a "real-estate problem." As someone said of real estate, the three most important things to consider are "location, location, location."

Animal laws are typically located in the state's agriculture and markets laws. If you flag down a state trooper or your friendly neighborhood police officer and ask them to show you their copy of the animal cruelty laws, they likely won't have one. What they will have (either in paper or electronic form) is something called the Graybook. The Graybook contains the state penal code and other laws commonly referenced by law enforcement, like vehicle and traffic laws – but no animal cruelty laws. Several companies publish the book. I think it's time to ask them to include the cruelty laws as part of the standard resource for New York's law enforcement professionals.

Book publishing is only part of the problem. It is common for police departments to send a dog control officer (DCO) to an animal cruelty call, which is another sign of the pervasive ignorance about these important laws. While most are well-meaning, DCOs have no training or authority to enforce animal cruelty laws. Animal crimes must be investigated and enforced by police officers and peace officers. When calling about suspected animal cruelty, we should all insist the police agency send a police officer.

A key to protecting animals is having strong laws in place that truly insure animal safety and prevent animal suffering. While 2013 was a good year for passing animal protection laws, we have a long way to go. That is why Mohawk Hudson Humane Society is one of the founding members of the New York State Animal Protection Federation, a group of animal sheltering and similar organizations working to pass stronger animal protection laws in the state.

Columbia County Dogs Rescued

When investigators from the Columbia-Greene Humane Society entered a home in Ghent, they knew there were some dogs living in poor conditions, but they didn't anticipate finding 50 dogs in the worst squalor they had ever seen. That number of dogs overwhelmed their shelter, and they reached out to Mohawk Hudson Humane Society (MHHS) for help.

We immediately dispatched a rescue team to Columbia County and came back to MHHS with 15 of the abuse victims. Our veterinary team examined and started treatment for all of them. They were covered head to tail in fleas and filth, but loved the attention they were getting. Soon after their arrival, one of the little dogs gave birth to two puppies and our total went up to 17 new guests. Mom and puppies went to a volunteer foster home while the others were prepared for adoption.

Once we knew they were stable, two of our good friends volunteered to groom the dogs: Head to Tail, in Schenectady, and Pet Spas of America, in Latham. Two of the groomers at Head to Tail even ended up adopting two of the dogs!

Soon after grooming and spay/neuter surgery, all of the dogs were adopted into new, loving homes. As of publication, the investigation into charges in the case is ongoing.

We are always happy to reach out and help our neighbors in other counties when they are in need. This case is a great example of how our generous supporters are helping animals throughout the Capital Region.

Mya's Story

When a beautiful, long-haired orange tabby was brought to the Humane Society by a caring couple who found her, two things stood out right away: she was incredibly sweet, and she had a serious injury to one of her legs. The cat, soon to be named Mya, could not bend her right hind leg.

Mya was immediately seen by our veterinarian and later examined by Orthopedic Specialist Dr. Tom Bowersox. It appeared her leg had been twisted, causing issues with her tendons and her sciatic nerve. Both doctors agreed that there was no way to repair the leg and it was likely causing discomfort that would only get worse over time. Mya would go to a foster home prior to surgery, then go back to recover



Mya's foster family quickly became extremely attached. One of her foster parents shared their experience:

"When I first agreed to foster Mya, it was just because I thought it would be a good challenge to foster an animal going through an amputation. When I went to pick her up, everyone at the shelter



kept telling me what a sweetheart she was! When I met her, it was that 'love at first sight' feeling. I knew she was coming home to stay.

"A few days after she first came home, I was diagnosed with a serious chronic illness and was taken out of work. I was unable to do anything but sit on the couch and watch TV. I felt depressed and helpless. Mya understood, more so than my own animals. She sat with me constantly, purring in my lap and putting her paw on my hand.

"After her leg was amputated and she was limited to a crate to restrict her activity, she would cry and cry because she wasn't near me. I found myself lying next to the crate and scratching her through the bars just to calm her down. When her limitations were lifted, she was right by my side again, even to the point of sitting on the side of the tub while I take a shower.

"My fiancé and I soon realized the bond Mya and I shared through our respective disabilities couldn't be broken. He agreed that we needed to adopt her. She's like my therapy cat, and I'm like her therapy human."
